The springtime display of wild snakeshead fritillaries at North Meadow is one of England's wildlife spectacles.

North Meadow has a great variety of wildflowers and is of international importance as one of the finest examples of a lowland hay meadow in Europe.

Cricklade Manorial Court has been in existence for over 700 years with officers including the High Bailiff, Town Crier, Constable and Ale Taster.

Today the Court jointly manages North Meadow with Natural England and is responsible for the grazing of the meadow.

Join Officers of the Court for a guided walk on the meadow covering the meadow's history, fritillaries, wildflowers, wildlife and the role of the Court.
